OPEN/MENS

WOMENS (W2STGN)

Women, Two-Spirit, Trans, Gender Non-Conforming

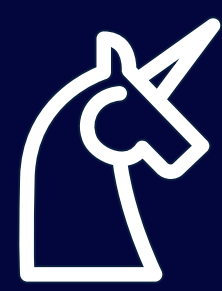
This category welcomes participation by those who self-identify as women, Two-Spirit, trans and gender non-conforming.

This category welcomes all individuals to participate regardless of gender; however, teams must adhere to a maximum number of self-identified men.



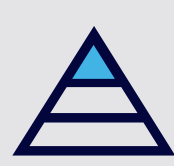

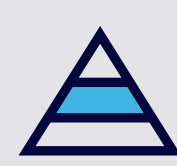
Competitive Tiers



TIER 1

Highest Level of Competition.

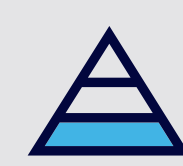
- All games are officiated except Ultimate (which is never officiated).
- Players should have significant experience in this sport.



TIER 2

Middle Level of Competition.

- Available in all leagues, but not necessarily all categories.
- All games are officiated except Ultimate (which is never officiated).
- Players should have moderate to high experience in this sport.



TIER 3

Lowest Level of Competition.

- Not available in all leagues.
- Players can be beginners, but some basic understanding of the sport is recommended.
- All games are officiated with the exception of Volleyball (which are only officiated in playoffs).

UBC Community Affiliations

All teams can compete as a Divisional team or a Campus Wide team.



Divisional Teams

Compete with Other People from your Faculty, Sorority, Fraternity, Residence or Collegia.

Divisional Teams represent specific groups of people or units on campus. Representing a unit on a divisional team allows that unit to accumulate points over the course of the year and earn awards at the end of the year.



Campus Wide Teams

Compete with any Eligible Person, Regardless of Unit.

Team performance is not tracked across multiple leagues, competitions, or events.
